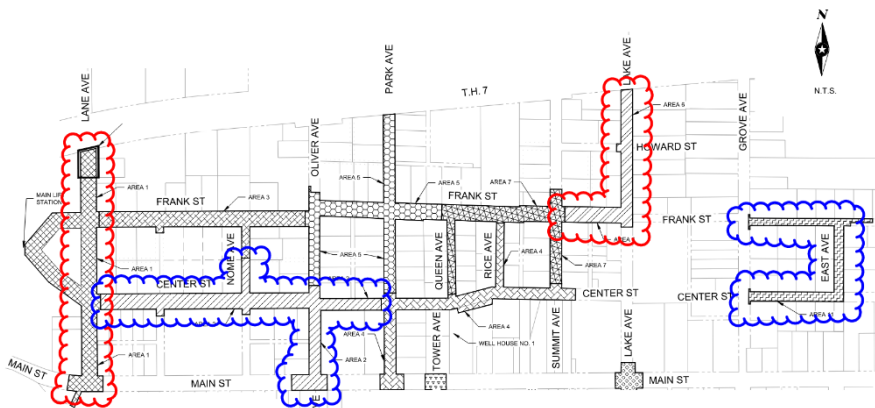

This letter is being sent to inform you of construction activity on the above-referenced project.

IF YOU ARE A LANDLORD, PLEASE SHARE THIS NEWSLETTER WITH YOUR RENTERS/TENANTS.

The contractor is expected to begin reclaiming the existing street pavement in the following areas as early as April 8th. The reclaiming process is expected to take about a week to complete. These areas are also clouded in red and blue on the map below. **Please avoid streetside parking in these areas beginning April 8th:**

- Lane Avenue from Main Street to TH7
- Nome Avenue from Center Street to Frank Street
- Oliver Avenue from Main Street to Center Street
- Lake Avenue from Frank Street to TH7
- East Avenue from Center Street to Frank Street
- Center Street from Lane Avenue to Park Avenue, and from Grove Avenue to East Avenue
- Frank Street from Summit Avenue to Lake Avenue, and from Grove Avenue to East Avenue



“Reclaimed” pavement is pulverized by equipment with spinning “teeth” until the particles reach a suitable gradation. This provides a granular material to be used as gravel base for the road. This recycling uses existing pavement, saves valuable landfill space, and helps control project costs. The reclaimed roadway will be leveled and compacted, and will then be drivable. **You will still have access to your driveway during this phase of the project.** Once the streets are reclaimed, blue areas may park on the street until further notice. Red areas may use the streets to access driveways but once reclaimed material is removed, residents will need to park on adjacent streets and walk to their homes. **Red areas should expect no access to driveways once underground utility construction begins.** If you intend to walk across your neighbor’s yard for access to your home during this time, please talk to your neighbor and ask their permission before doing so.
